We had 106 parents (over 59%) respond so thank you for taking the time to complete the survey.

## Overall the responses were extremely positive.

- -100% of parents indicate that their child feels safe and is well looked after is happy at school
- -100% feel the school is well led and managed
- -99% would recommend the school to other parents
- -98%+ of parents indicate that their child is well looked after and is happy at school
- -98% of parents indicate the school ensures the children are well behaved
- -97% of parents feel the school supports their child's personal development
- -96% of parents felt the school responds well to any concerns raised

Our aim is always to provide the best possible educational experiences for the children and all feedback is taken seriously. I have been through all the written responses and a summary will be shared, along with the results above, with governors and staff to reflect on strengths and potential areas we need to explore further.
