This half term, the teachers have reviewed the diversity curriculum to ensure we teach the children more about the diverse world in which we live. For example when teaching RE, we want children to learn from first hand experiences, so visits and visitors help children learn more about the different world religions. This half term saw our Year 5 children visit Western Europe's largest mosque in Morden; the children were fascinated by this place of worship. A trip to one of local churches is also planned so children can make comparisons and learn about the importance of respect and tolerance in the world we live in today.

Miss Archer, our PSHE leader, organised for our Year 5 and 6 children to learn more about disabilities. Mik Scarlett, the CEO from the PHAB charity, led a talk and question and answer session with the children about what life is like growing up with a disability. The children gained a lot from this talk and were so inquisitive with their questions.

Earlier this month, to help raise awareness of diversity and equality, we had Loki Nambombe in for the day to lead assemblies and workshops with our Y5/6 children. The theme for the day was 'anti-racism - showing kindness to everyone'. More learning opportunities have been planned for the summer term, including this same workshop being repeated for the children in Year 3/4.
