MATHS

In maths, the main focus this half term has been on fractions. The children have worked to master ordering, simplifying, adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing fractions as well as finding fractions of amounts. They have made progress in developing their accuracy and applying reasoning skills to solve complex problems. It has been encouraging to see their confidence grow and we have used the last couple of weeks to really consolidate the more challenging aspects of fraction and number, ahead of the Christmas break.

ENGLISH MICHAEL MORPURGO

In English this half term, the children have been studying Michael Morpurgo's War Horse. Inspired by the story, they have explored life during World War I through their writing. They have written informal letters from soldiers in the trenches, providing a glimpse into the emotions and experiences of wartime.



They also created detailed non-chronological reports about life in the trenches and wrote fictional descriptions of Joey, the horse, running through the chaos of the battlefield using figurative language. To end the unit, the children wrote thoughtful poems in response to the theme of war. Their writing has shown creativity and attention to detail.

SCIENCE

In science, we have been studying evolution and inheritance. This began with exploring how animals have adapted to different environments and how living things with traits are better suited to their environment and are more likely to survive and reproduce.







In addition, the children explored Charles Darwin's work in the Galapagos Islands and explore the differences between inherited and environmental traits.



In history, the children learned about the Ancient Greeks and their influence on the modern world. They explored primary and secondary sources to understand more about the Olympic Games, daily life in Ancient Greece, and the role of Greek gods in their culture.

In computing, the children developed graphic design and image editing skills, which complemented their work in art, where they turned their attention to re-designing food packaging, combining creativity with practical design considerations.

We have even packed fun-filled learning opportunities even into the final week of term! This week, the children have participated in an online workshop run by the Natural History Museum to round off our science learning about Evolution and Inheritance. We were excited to welcome Mrs Mead back to the team this week and she will be resuming responsibility for 6SM as well as her role as Year Group Leader from January.
