

Top Tips!

When children are learning their spellings or trying to spell a word that is unfamiliar, we always encourage them to sound it out and see if they can work out what graphemes (letters) make the different phonemes (sounds).

Below are the different ways that sounds can be formed.



We always encourage the children to 'have a go' before they ask for help and use a dictionary to check!

If a child is really struggling with a word, we use ____ to give them some clues as to what letters are needed. Tall boxes for tall letters and longer boxes for letters that go under the line, for example:



When children get their new weekly spellings, stick them up around the house. So wherever your child goes they can see and practice their words!





Colour code the spelling pattern in their weekly spellings so they can see the pattern clearly. This will hopefully jog their memory when it comes to writing the word in their quiz or writing.














Spelling Word Search!

Etymological knowledge (discussing the origin of the word, where it came from!) Understanding the origin of words can allow pupils to try and make links and see why it is spelt the way it is.

For example: audi relates to hearing - audible, audience, audition

Rainbow Write

First write each word in pencil.
Then trace over each word three times. Each time you trace, you must use a DIFFERENT colour crayon. Trace neatly and you will see a rainbow!

Squiggly Spelling Words

You are going to write your spelling words two times. First write in regular letters. Then write the words again in squiggly letters!

Three Times!

Write each spelling word three times.

First, write each word in pencil.

Second write each word in crayon.

Third, write each word in marker.

You MUST write neatly!

Scrambled Words

Fold a piece of paper three times lengthwise (making three long rectangular columns).

Write your words in the first column.

Then write them again with the letters all mixed up (scrambled) in the second column.

Put your words aside. Come back later to unscramble your words. Write the unscrambled words in the third column.

Spell-er-size!

Pretend you are a cheerleader and call out the letters of your words!

Cheer up high for letters that touch the top handwriting line (ex. t and l), hands on hips for middle letters (ex. a and e), and cheer down low for low letters (Ex. y and j).

Magazine Words

Use an old magazine and find your words (or the letters that make up your word).

Cut them out and glue on your paper.

spelling Flowers

Draw a picture of a great big flower. Write each of your spelling words on one of the flower petals or on a leaf. Draw extra flowers if you run out of room.

Surround Words

Write your words on graph paper. Write "middle" letters, one letter in each box.
Use two boxes for "tall" letters like t and I and "low" letters like j and g. Then outline the words using different colors.
