



## PSHE

### **INTENT- What does PSHE look like at The Greville?**

At The Greville personal, social and health economic education (PSHE) enables our children to become healthy (both physically and mentally), independent and responsible members of a society. Alongside the school values of respect, responsibility, resilience and kindness, the curriculum aims to help pupils understand how they are developing personally and socially, and tackles many of the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up. We provide our children with opportunities for them to learn about rights and responsibilities and appreciate what it means to be a member of a diverse society. Our children are encouraged to develop their sense of self-worth by playing a positive role in contributing to school life and the wider community.

### **IMPLEMENTATION - So, how are we going to deliver this?**

PSHE is implemented using the JIGSAW scheme of work, a whole school cyclical programme, which delivers relevant and topical content, which is supported by Votes for School assemblies and school council; which values the child's voice. The scheme is accessible to all children including those with SEND and social disadvantages and aims for all children to become global citizens. Throughout the year, learning is split into six different topics: Being Me, Celebrating Differences, Dreams & Goals, Healthy Me, Relationships and Changing Me. Each year group will cover the same topic but with a slightly different focus that changes and builds upon previous learning and skills. PSHE is delivered through high quality teaching weekly and led by the class teachers. The different topics and themes are explored using material supplied by Jigsaw and also enriched with visitors throughout the year and through other first-hand experiences. Although PSHE is taught discretely each week, key values are woven through our curriculum to ensure that the important messages are being revisited and reinforced.

### **IMPACT - What difference is this curriculum making to our children?**

The impact of our PSHE curriculum ensures that our children will thrive as individuals and become confident, respectful, tolerant and well-rounded human beings. Our children can articulate their understanding about each of the areas that are covered and how they are relevant to their own lives. Our children understand that they have a voice and throughout their time at school, by joining in with the PSHE lessons and taking part in our Votes for School Assemblies, they will learn how to use it to make a positive impact on society. Through exposure to different real-life situations, global issues and problems, children will build up tolerance and a sense of responsibility for being a global citizen.
